Raw Risk Assessment and Rating

Contributing Factors (what could cause the risk to exist?)

- TasTAFE has a legal duty to eliminate, or if not practical, minimise the risks of COVID-19 in the workplace. Vaccination as a control measure will protect employees against infection spread, severe infection, hospitalisation, and limit the risk of death from having been exposed to COVID-19 at work.
- Tasmanian border reopening on the 15th of December in line with the State Government's Roadmap and the resulting predicted Delta strain outbreak by the Kirby Institute modelling.
- TasTAFE facilities are open to any member of the public with many common use areas such as cafeterias, libraries, kitchens, lounge areas, lifts, toilets, stairs. Every TasTAFE facility is a public-facing education facility.
- TasTAFE staff that may not interact regularly with members of the public will still interact regularly with other TasTAFE staff and use the above mentioned common areas/facilities.
- Given nature of facilities there is a high likelihood that if an individual came onto a TasTAFE facility who was positive for COVID-19 with no or mild symptoms they would be likely to spread the illness to others.
- Most TasTAFE employees do not fit neatly into the 4 tiers of workplaces identified by the Fair Work Ombudsman to provide guidance on mandatory vaccination. Therefore risk assessment has been undertaken with the safety of all employees, students, contractors and visitors in mind.
- Many industries are moving to mandatory vaccination for their employees potentially impacting TasTAFE staff dealings with those industries and employers.
- Use of other measures outlined in the TasTAFE COVID-19 Safety Plan are not always practical, or not enough on their own, given the nature of TasTAFE's business.

- Other mitigation actions such as further density restrictions, updating of air conditioning systems, rapid-testing, temperature checks and regular testing and widespread use of masks may be considered.
- Some students and employees will not be able to be vaccinated for legitimate medical reasons and need to be protected.
- TasTAFE's desire to contribute to the safety of students, employers, contractors and visitors to TasTAFE campuses from COVID-19 impacts.
- TasTAFE's desire to provide the best opportunity for business continuity to support all students and employers.
- Strategies required to control risk to reflect TasTAFE's risk appetite for work, health and safety factors.

Consequences (what are the possible impacts if the risk materialises?)

Health and Wellbeing

- o Staff illness (short-term and/or long-term) or death.
- o Student or visitor illness or death as a result of catching COVID-19 while interacting with TasTAFE staff.
- o Infection spread within TasTAFE and the wider community.

Business Disruption

- o Unavailability of work force and/or facilities.
- o Interruption to student learning.
- o Inability for TasTAFE staff to conduct site visits.
- o Interruption to industry relationships.
- o Loss of revenue.

Legal

- o Penalties for Board and management for non-compliance including fines and/or imprisonment.
- o Possible legal action by employees if they contract COVID-19 in the workplace.
- o Increasing workers compensation claims from those who contract COVID-19 in the workplace.

Reputation

- o Loss of confidence in a safe workplace by staff.
- o Loss of confidence in a safe learning environment by students and others.
- o Loss of confidence for contractors coming into TasTAFE facilities.
- o Reputational damage and loss of public confidence.
- o Reduction in number of students.

employees who have not been vaccinated. Of 435 responses, 10 staff were not vaccinated with at least one dose.

Additional Information:

Students will be advised of the requirement for vaccination ASAP, with the process to capture this information implemented in January prior to the majority of students returning on site in Feb 2022.

All staff will be advised that with the social distancing requirement of 1.5M in place, where this cannot be maintained mask wearing should be adopted. The optional use of mask wearing in all settings will be encouraged.
